Improving Child and Adolescent Mental Health, October 13 12:30-1:30pm

Opportunities and Challenges for Multi-level Culturally Congruent Preventive Interventions Most of our knowledge about how interventions affect children's emotional well-being comes from high-income or predominantly English-speaking countries. This <u>program</u> will draw on the experience of international studies with at-risk children and adolescents integrating multi-level intervention strategies that are aimed at: 1) building children's individual competencies and skills to deal with traumatic and adverse childhood experiences, 2) strengthening family-level resources and support systems and addressing structural factors such as poverty and gender inequalities. This program is presented by the Brown School in partnership with the International Center for Child Health and Development.

Digital Health Equity Summit, November 3rd & 4th

Attendees will learn how digital health tools are already being used to bridge geographical issues, language barriers, and affordability gaps, and how robust individual-level data can help health organizations improve patient outcomes. Panels will also explore how institutional practices and policies should change to ensure the inequities in our current health care system are not carried over as the system continues to modernize.
